JUNE 25 STRUGGLING FOR WHOLENESS; FAITH COMMUNITY & MENTAL HEALTH Carla Miller, Director of Multigenerational Religious Exploration; and Paul Wester, Worship Associate

Many of us find the spiritual and social connectedness that encourages wholeness through participation in faith communities. How does our faith, and our church, keep us mentally and emotionally healthy? How might PBUUC become even more welcoming of those with mental illness, and supportive of their loved ones, than we already are?

- MANY of us have struggled with our own emotional/mental stability at some time, at least 1:4 statistically, and that's only those diagnosed/treated!!
- Acceptance of mental health as a spectrum from healthy to severe illness, just as physical illness, and not as the fault of an individual.
- The spiritual aspect of and connection to mental health/ mental health as involving the whole of human's wellbeing and functioning- mental, emotional, social, spiritual- not simply a disease of mind that needs only professional care.
- How a faith community can serve as a social and spiritual support for those struggling.
