Multigenerational Religious Exploration

Exploring a World of Wonder with Pokemon??? Really??? & Potter

This coming year in Religious Exploration, Paint Branch's first through third grade children will be creating their own "PokUUmon" creatures as they explore the natural world. This, along with our continuing engagement in a Harry Potter theme with our fourth to sixth grade group, is an experiment in introducing popular themes into our religious exploration.

I imagine some of you; parents and elders alike, are questioning skeptically, "What on Earth does any of this have to do with developing a strong U.U. faith?" and "Aren't we getting a little carried away with pop culture here?"

1. What on Earth do Pokemon and Potter have to do with developing a strong U.U. faith?

Our theme in R.E. for 2017-2018 is Learning from our Sources. The curriculum we are using as our base for the first-third grader class is "A World of Wonder," based in the exploration of nature, connects with three sources; the sense of awe and wonder, the guidance of reason and results of science and the earth-centered traditions. A PokU-Umon overlay will add the four elements of many earth-centered traditions as we group cards into the families of earth, air, fire, and water. It is also clear that this curriculum is ideal for Paint Branch's wonderful woodsy setting, with an age group that is filled with curiosity and appreciation of the natural world.

Harry Potter, or *Harry & U.U.*, we learned last year, was a deeply meaningful learning engagement with social justice themes. This year, as we continue and expand this curriculum, we will incorporate the stories from Christian and Judaic sources, with themes of Love and Justice. And, we can still engage our young people in the service projects and the spells and potions they loved throughout the past year!


2. Aren't we getting a little carried away with the pop culture? If "getting carried away with pop culture" means sacrificing our children's faith development, learning and growth, then no. We in MRE are committed to the children's faith development.

If, on the other hand, you are asking if we are highly attuned to providing fun, contemporary themes that will engage children and strengthen the chance that they attend regularly, then, Yes! We are all about it.
